Fun With Snow



If you don't have snow, use sand or other materials. Recipes on following pages.

Snowballs

If you don't have snow, make snowballs with pompoms or wadded up newspaper or substitute a real ball.

Snowman Bowling

Decorate plastic bottles or similar items to look like snowmen. Fill halfway with water so the wind won't knock them down. Use snowballs to bowl.

Snowball Toss

Use a container, like a pail or a hamper, and toss snowballs into them. To make it more challenging, set several up at different distances and keep track of who got the most.

Make Snow

Mix $\frac{1}{2}$ cup hair conditioner and 2 cups baking soda.

Snow Race

Line up holding a spoon with a cotton ball in it. Race across the yard, or room, without dropping the cotton ball. If you drop it you have to go back to the beginning.

Snow Paint

Mix cornstarch and water until you have the right consistency. Add food coloring. Use it to paint the snow.

Colored Ice Cubes

Put water in an ice cube tray with food coloring. Add a craft stick to hold on to while painting. Allow to freeze.

Snow Dough

Mix together 2 cups cornstarch, 1 ¼ cups unscented hand lotion, and 2-3 drops of peppermint extract. Sprinkle some cornstarch on a flat surface and knead the dough until ready.

Knock Them Down

Decorate 6 white cups like snowmen. Stack them like a pyramid (3 on the bottom, 2 in the middle, and 1 on top). Toss a snowball to knock them down.

Snow Slime

Put 2 cups of silver glitter glue in a bowl. Slowly add 1-2 cups of liquid starch. You have to judge by the consistency. You may want to refrigerate it a while before play so it's cold.
